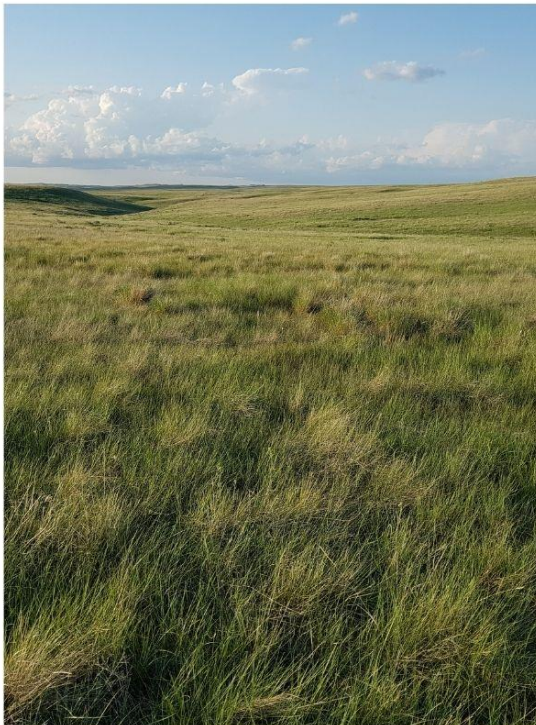

Event Overview

Name of the Event: 9th Native Prairie Restoration/Reclamation Workshop

Event Theme: "Restoration, Reclamation, Resilience: Improving, Soil, Water and Habitat"

Date: February 8th-10th, 2022

Venue: Online. Website address will be announced on <https://www.pcap-sk.org/upcoming-events/nprw2021>

Due to the Covid-19 Global Pandemic and following the success of our recent virtual NPRRW 2021, we will be hosting this workshop as a virtual event. While there will be some limitations with the hands-on exercises, we are excited to be able to reach more participants from a wider geographic range than ever before.

Number of People Expected: 250-300 people

Where Participants are from: Saskatoon, Regina, Swift Current, Kindersley, Weyburn, Estevan, Val Marie, etc. Outside of Province: Alberta, Manitoba, Montana, North and South Dakota, Wyoming and beyond.

We are expecting representatives from the following companies/organizations.

Event Description

For the safety of workshop participants and to prevent the spread of Covid-19, the 2022 NPRRW will be an online format.

Plenary Speakers: Presentations will focus on the theme of building resilience in restoration/reclamation projects, and will be related to either soil, water or habitat. Leading industry experts from across North America will be presenting their topic from an agricultural, industrial, or ecological perspective. Presentations will be an online webinar format, approximately 35 minutes long with 15 minutes for questions from participants. Speakers will include land managers, researchers and academics, project managers or industry experts.

Poster Session: Innovative research projects about invasive species, endangered species, restoration and reclamation case studies, and native seed research will be on display in a virtual room and poster presenters will have a designated profile page with a pre-recorded video of their poster presentation and/or a slide deck of their poster. Workshop participants will be able to ask questions through a chat box.

Tradeshow: With the goal of networking and developing sustainable and resilient partnerships, native seed producers and users, environmental consulting companies, watershed groups and native plant organizations will have booths and displays available in a virtual exhibit hall. Workshop participants will be able to see the exhibitor's booth on their computer screen, download brochures and resources as well as network with exhibitors through a private or public chat. Trade show exhibitors with virtual booths will be able to interact with their target audience and track their return on investment. Trade show exhibitors and workshop participants will be able to chat publicly over text or privately over text and video call (with PheedLoop Meet).

Case Studies: Designed to facilitate hands-on learning experiences and networking, participants will be grouped with other workshop participants from other disciplines to share perspectives and problem solve relevant case studies focusing on restoration, reclamation and remediation. Topics may also include urban restoration, species at risk, invasive species and more.

How this event will impact the community

The native prairie ecosystem is home to many species at risk, including both flora and fauna. As these species populations continue to decline and native lands continue to be altered, native prairie restoration and reclamation efforts remain a priority. The restoration/reclamation community is learning that soil is more important for the success of restoration and reclamation efforts and our knowledge of this topic is very limited. This event will spend a day focusing on soil and its role in improving restoration/reclamation projects.

This event will bring together stakeholders, land owners and land managers, environmental advocates and students from across North America to share ideas and experiences. This engaging online forum will provide insight into the opportunities and challenges that lie ahead for building resilience in restoration and reclamation projects. The importance of water during a time of

climate change and drought will be a key feature of this event, with a day dedicated to presentations about drought proofing and restoring wetlands.

Following the success of last year's virtual workshop, this event will bring in new ideas and perspectives from new presenters and participants from a wider geographic range than an in-person event.

This event will impact local communities, as workshop participants will leave with new ideas and information on how to improve their restoration/reclamation projects. Community leaders, native prairie advocates and land managers will be able to better address issues such as reclaiming lands, restoring species at risk populations, invasive species management and more. Indirectly, this conference will leave the native prairie ecosystem a better place for generations to come.

Event Background and History

The first Native Prairie Restoration and Reclamation Workshop was held in 2011, after participants from the 2010 Prairie Conservation and Endangered Species Conference indicated there was a need for more information specific to native prairie restoration and reclamation. The Native Prairie Restoration/Reclamation Workshop takes place two of every three years (skipping the third year for the triennial Prairie Conservation and Endangered Species Conference). The workshop usually rotates between Regina, SK and Saskatoon, SK.

2022 – Virtual Online Workshop – " Restoration, Reclamation, Resilience: Improving, Soil, Water and Habitat "

The overarching theme of the 2022 Native Prairie Restoration and Reclamation Workshop will be "**Restoration, Reclamation, Resilience: Improving, Soil, Water and Habitat**". Within this theme, issues in the following areas will be addressed:

- Soil: biochemistry, industrial restoration, biocrust restoration
- Water: wetlands and drought, aquatic habitat restoration
- Habitat: wildlife habitat and agriculture, pollination, forbs and industry

The primary objective of this workshop is to hear from all stakeholders involved in native prairie land use:

- First Nations Groups

- Government (federal, provincial, municipal)
- Ranchers and land owners
- Education and researchers
- Environmental not for profit organizations
- Industry and utilities
- Watershed groups

The aim of this workshop is to bring all of these stakeholders together to exchange knowledge, share lessons learned and address challenges in native prairie restoration/reclamation during a time of climate change and a global pandemic.

The Saskatchewan Prairie Conservation Action Plan (SK PCAP) Partnership brings together 30 agencies and organizations representing producers, industry, provincial & federal governments, environmental non-government organizations, research and educational institutions working towards a common vision of prairie and species at risk conservation in Saskatchewan. The SK PCAP Partnership has proven to be an important forum for guiding conservation and management efforts within Saskatchewan's Prairie Ecozone as it:

- Increases communication and collaboration amongst partners, thereby reducing duplications;
- Addresses gaps in native prairie research/activities and programming;
- Guides the development of programs and policies that reward sustainable use and promote ecological health and integrity including species at risk recovery, and;
- Improves public understanding of native prairie and species at risk.
