From an Outdoor Green Space:

- There are 29 provincial parks in Saskatchewan that are open for day-use and camping for Saskatchewan Residents. Get out and explore the native prairie ecosystem!
- Hike, canoe, camp or explore in one of Saskatchewan's 70 regional parks! Now opened for day-use and overnight camping.
