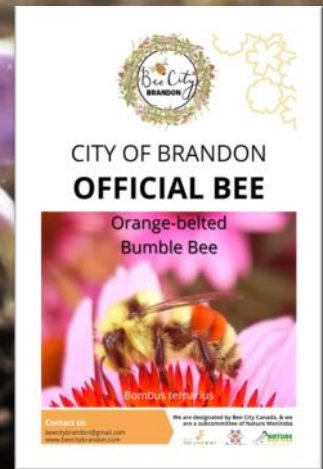

Presentation Summary:

The City of Brandon became Manitoba's first Bee City in 2018. The three pillars of being a Bee City is that we have to educate the citizens of Brandon about native pollinators and plants, create native plant / pollinator gardens and celebrate Pollinator Week. Join us for a brief summary of pollinators, what we can do to help them out and how we can work together to make a difference for wildlife in our own communities.

About the Presenter:

Sherry Punak-Murphy, a trained bio-geographer and insect lover, has worked as a Base Biologist at CFB Shilo in Manitoba for over 30 years. CFB Shilo is located within the Aspen Parkland area and has hectares of native mixed-grass prairie. Now, after helping establish Brandon as Manitoba's only designated Bee City, she is jokingly called the "Queen Bee" aka as the Chairperson of Bee City Brandon.
