The ecological turmoil of the nineteenth century meant that our earliest settlers found the grassland ecosystem in a damaged state. In particular, the riparian areas along the many streams were in poor condition. This situation can be reversed by taking action. A few simple but effective solutions will get your streams on the path to productivity.
