# Native Prairie Speaker Series *Webinar*

**Speaker: Jordan Vos, University of Lethbridge**

**About this Webinar:**

Amphibians remain one of the more understudied groups of animals, and as such, many species often lack fundamental data about their dietary habits. Jordan Vos, a master's student at the University of Lethbridge, aims to fill some of the knowledge gaps about the diet of Alberta's prairie amphibians. In this presentation, she will discuss the value of dietary analysis using stomach flushing to identify common items in the diet of prairie amphibians. This work has implications for the conservation of prairie species, including potential future work on how pesticides may be taken into amphibians through their diet.

**About the Speaker:**

Jordan Vos has completed a Bachelor of Ecosystem Management at Lethbridge College and is currently working on her Master of Biological Science at the University of Lethbridge. Her lifelong fascination with amphibians has led to her research, focusing on diet analysis of prairie amphibians in southern Alberta. Jordan has worked as a park interpreter and nature program leader for five years, gaining a passion for the outdoors (hiking, identifying plant species, and watching wildlife), and storytelling. She remains a passionate steward of sustainable agriculture as a researcher and a rancher's daughter.
