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About this Webinar:

Many people in Saskatchewan have come across archaeological artifacts and may even be in possession of collections of these materials. A lot of artifacts found in the province are made from stone and bone and can be easily identified as hunting tools like arrowheads. However, sometimes an artifact's use or function is not readily apparent. This session will provide an overview of archaeological artifacts found in Saskatchewan, the long human history of the province, and what kind of information we can glean from these objects. Information on how to record an archaeological site and collections as well as opportunities for getting involved in archaeology will also be shared.

Dr. Karin Steuber, PhD, RPA

Karin is the Public Outreach Coordinator for the Saskatchewan Archaeological Society and an adjunct professor with the Department of Archaeology and Anthropology at the University of Saskatchewan. She has been an archaeologist for over 20 years working across the Canadian Plains with a focus on lithic technologies.

Dr. Andrew Miller

Dr. Miller has worked with Plains Cree, Saulteaux, Anishinaabe, Dene and Rarámuri communities of Canada and Northern Mexico documenting traditional land use and knowledge since 1996. The present work arises from work with Touchwood Agency Tribal Council Elders with whom he has worked since 2017. He holds a PhD in Natural Resource and Environmental Management, from the University of Manitoba, a MS in Forestry Science from Northern Arizona University and a BA in Geography from the University of Texas at Austin.
