International Year of Rangelands and Pastoralists 2026 Saskatchewan Community Engagement Forum



You are welcome whether you come from a multigenerational ranching family, are newly immigrated to Saskatchewan, whether you are First Nations or Metis caring for the land since time immemorial, are involved in conservation, research prairie ecosystems, are involved in education or community programing, are a budding environmental activist, enjoy visiting native prairie places or have never been to a grassland.

We are excited to have you join us in a discussion about rangelands, how you experience it and how you envision celebrating it leading up to and during IYRP.

- To increase worldwide understanding of the importance of rangelands and pastoralists for food security and environmental services
- To mobilize people worldwide to address today's challenges and to grasp new opportunities in rangelands management and pastoralism
- To boost efforts for creating new knowledge and sharing experiences and practices
